We interrupt this note to bring you... Zubie TDX!



I was debating which test to do, trying to guess the weather and roads, when a cocker spaniel friend in Tennessee said "I see you are entered in the TDX test. I'm entered too. Would you like to stay with me that weekend?" So even though it was a longer drive and unfamiliar terrain, I pulled from Sullivan and off we went to Tennessee.

It was a very long drive, a total of 1,418 miles and we were only gone from

home for 39 hours. Having a place to stay with a yard made a huge difference for Zubie. He was able to run around and

explore when we arrived on Saturday and again early Sunday morning before we headed out to the test. The day was overcast with temps in the 50s. I was very thankful for the cloud cover since Zubie heats up really fast in the sun.

We drew first track out of three entries so very quickly it was time to follow our judges to the start of our track. The test is held in a state park with a lot of woods, gravel roads, and vegetation about waist high. The park is used by hunters and there were ATV and vehicle tracks throughout the fields. I gave Zubie a minute to sniff, a little water he didn't want, and then he drug me to the start flag and slapped the start article. I quickly stowed the sock and hurried to keep up with Zubie because he was on a mission. 110 yards, then an open right turn and Zubie stopped and slapped a wash cloth.

Then we entered the brambles as they were labeled on the map. Zubie tracks with his nose right on the ground and thanks to the plotting day footsteps, he was soon stuck underneath a tight mess of stickery brambles. He couldn't move at all. I had to cut him free before we could continue. Then step over a log and down I went as Zubie got stuck again. So get myself up, cut Zubie free again and thankfully we emerged from that evil obstacle.

Zubie was working so fast I was almost running and I couldn't see him on the track because of the tall vegetation. All I could do was feel the line and follow. Zubie made a right, then two lefts and then an-

other right and the line stopped moving so I worked my way up to find him standing at a bandana. Zubie was looking tired and we were both feeling the humidity so I stowed the bandana and gave him a quick drink of water and one last time asked him to "find me another". 65 yards later, Zubie took an open right turn and then started working left and right along a tree line. My heart was pounding, wondering why he wasn't on the track and then he stopped and slapped the glove. The judges didn't want the track to go into the woods and they needed more yardage so they meandered to the finish.


#### VST - HARDEST FIRST?

Indian Nations Tracking Club VST test is a challenge. In March, in Oklahoma, it can be 80 degrees or 30 degrees. The test itself is held on 2 separate college campuses that have their different challenges. At OU, it can be the dogs in the backyards that surround the site, the fast moving traffic on the 2 roads that border the campus, or the Frisbee golf course that coves the campus. On the TU campus, it is a bustling campus with sorority and fraternity parties, landscaping, and construction noises. Needless to say you need to be prepared for anything. Even things not associated with tracking per say...

Ok so not the start one wants for a test weekend: 1 injured dog, 1 sick handler on top of a road trip. After spending Friday night and all day Saturday in a hotel room eating crackers and 7-up, I was exhausted before we even started the test. Vegas was on crate rest due to an agility injury the weekend before, and Maddie was perfectly happy staying in bed, but we got up, packed the bags, and headed for the draw site.

As luck would have it, we drew the first track, best chance at an even remotely cool track given the temperatures they were predicting. I informed the judges we would be wearing a cool coat while we discussed the issues of getting us to our track. The track began right off a busy road and the club preferred the entrant cross at the light. As she paralleled the 2<sup>nd</sup> leg all of sudden her head came up and pointed up past a flower bed to an article. We backed up and she ran up the stairs to indicate her plastic article. We then moved into the parking
